ANTIBIOTICS AND ANIMAL WELFARE COMMITMENTS:

We are committed to working with land-based protein suppliers that follow the policies of the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) and the Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS) concerning the labeled use of any antibiotics and their policies on animal welfare requirements. Specifically, we audit our suppliers' adherence to the following guidelines:

- Medically necessary antibiotics are used only to control, treat and prevent disease in food animals in consultation with a licensed veterinarian, following Food and Drug Administration (FDA) regulations. Further, the use of antibiotics important to human health for growth promotion in food animals is prohibited by law.
- Animals are treated with respect and cared for under the guidance of the Five Freedoms of animal welfare.

COMMITMENTS SPECIFIC TO THE BEEF SUPPLY CHAIN:

We are committed to using beef suppliers that are industry leaders in sustainable beef production practices, strictly adhering to North American Meat Institute (NAMI) and National Cattlemen's Beef Association (NCBA) Beef Quality Assurance (BQA) animal handling standards.

COMMITMENTS SPECIFIC TO THE POULTRY SUPPLY CHAIN:

Our poultry suppliers follow the National Chicken Council (NCC) poultry welfare guidelines, and we are working towards adding suppliers who deliver meat from farm-raised and cage-free chickens.
